Principal's Print



Dear Parents and Community Members -

With Semester One having just passed us by, the time has arrived for us all to reflect and set some goals for the remainder of 2017. With around 65 school days left for Year 12s and around 90 days until the end of Semester Two for Year 11s, all students should reflect on what extra efforts will benefit their progress and results. I encourage all students to take on board the Semester One feedback they will receive and set some goals to focus on achieving their best possible results. This includes using the Term Two break as academic catch up and study time, not just a holiday. The break obviously provides the chance for students to relax and refresh, but the more committed students will use the time to get an advantage on the competition.

Goal Setting Meetings with Year 12 students

This term I have been involved in 30 minute goal setting meetings with our Year 12 students in groups of 10. The focus has been around looking forward to the end of Year 12 and identifying a goal and steps to be taken to achieve that goal. As I have said to the students a goal without steps is not a goal, it is just a dream or hope that you will achieve something. Having actions sets you on the path to achieving your goal! To date 202 Year 12 students have participated in these meetings. I will be following up with the 30 students who have not yet booked their meeting time with me.

2017 WA Meningococcal W School Immunisation Program

In 2017 WA Health will conduct a school-based meningococcal vaccination program for students in Years 10, 11 and 12. The vaccine protects against 4 strains of Meningococcal disease, including the particularly concerning 'W' strain. A single dose of vaccine will be given to students at school.

The vaccinations will be conducted on **Wednesday August 2nd** for Manea students.

Country Week

This is an annual multi-sport event carnival held in Perth, between rural high schools from Western Australia. The carnival is organised by School Sport WA and is recognised as being the biggest event of its kind in the southern hemisphere. The event typically involves about 40 schools with around 3,000 students and over 200 teachers and support staff. Manea is sending some 130 students this year and we wish them all the very best as they represent the College during the week.

Year 11: Visit to Helicopter 652 Base

The HMSP students along with Certificate III Paramedical students attended an excursion to the new \$7 million Critical Response Helicopter Base earlier this term. Students were able to hear from the 'on-duty' Pilot and Paramedic team regarding their careers and the critical response program. It was fortuitous that as the guests had almost finished speaking they were called to respond to an emergency. The students and staff were able to witness a quick, calm and professional team depart the base in less than 12 minutes. We were also able to view the flight simulation training room, planning and meeting areas as well the living quarters of the 24 hour response team. A special thank you to Annette Matlejan of St John Ambulance, for her liaison work in gaining access to the base, and to the staff at Helicopter 652 including the stand in pilot who completed our fantastic tour and visit.

The South West Aboriginal Medical Service promote health and wellbeing for all individuals. There is an opportunity for all health services providers and organisations to promote their services to the community.

There will be a range of activities occurring on the day including:

- Health Expo: for health services providers and organisations to promote their services to the community
