At Manea we are highly flexible and focus on the individual needs of our students. We have a flexible timetable model that allows students to assist in designing their own combination of courses and qualifications.

Year 11 in particular is a year of opportunity at Manea, a chance to explore your aspirations and interests and for students to determine their pathway into Year 12 and beyond College life. This provision of opportunity at Manea is extended in the form of financial support for VET focused students to access nationally recognised training qualifications as a part of their final years of schooling.

Manea was the first regional secondary school in WA to become an independent public school and we have used this flexibility to benefit students, including establishing an extensive tutoring program, appointing specialist personnel, conducting holiday revision seminars and heavily subsidising the cost of VET course fees for our students.
